Media reports focus our eyes on tragedies known nationwide, and we inadvertently add to the suffering by ignoring the heartbreaking losses of individual shootings that have become so common that we are numb.

The effects of gun violence are immense; tearing families apart is just the most obvious one. Our great nation finds itself on the verge of panic in even innocent situations. Just before the ew year, a metal sign fell in the Arden Fair Mall during a scuffle. One person yelled "Shooter" without thinking and sent the people in the mall fleeing for their lives as chaos ensued. Our nation is now constantly afraid that there is nothing we can do to stop a maniac with a gun.
